**Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act**

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, Part IV*:

James and Jane Stoutenburgh House  
10748 Victoria Square Blvd  
Markham, ON

The James and Jane Stoutenburgh House has design and physical value as a unique example of mid-nineteenth century eclectic residential architecture, and a noteworthy example of polychromatic brickwork. The James and Jane Stoutenburgh House has historical and associative value as it speaks to the religious and cultural mosaic of Markham Township. Further, the property has contextual value as a local landmark at the south-west corner of Victoria Square Boulevard and Elgin Mills Road. It is one of a grouping of late-nineteenth and early-twentieth century residences that are important in defining, maintaining and supporting the character and extent of the historic hamlet of Victoria Square
